Please continue to support your child by practicing times tables at home as often as you can.

Homework:

This week, the children have been set Maths homework. This is glued into their Orange homework books.

Reading - Children are to read every night for 10-20 minutes. The title of the book and page numbers read over the course of the week should be recorded in their yellow reading record. This can be done each time the child reads, e.g.: 1- 5, 6-8 or as one entry, e.g.: 12-50, and parents/ carers are required to sign the reading record once per week. Big Cat and Library books can be changed during the class Library Session.

Spelling- Spellings were handed out on Tuesday and will be tested, as usual on, Monday. Please ensure the sheet is completed by writing each word three times. The children will then need to choose 5 words from the spelling list and write 5 spelling sentences in their orange homework book. This is an important part of the homework set each week.

PE Kits

Please make sure all children have full PE kit in school all week. All children should have a tracksuit to wear for both Indoor and Outdoor PE lessons. Please make sure they have layers to keep them cosy and warm!

Snacks

This is a reminder that the children are welcome to bring in a snack to eat at breaktime. However, our school policy is that this should only be **FRESH FRUIT or VEGETABLES**.

Unfortunately, we have seen other non-fruit/vegetable related items being eaten at this time.

This week, Mrs Garland recommends,

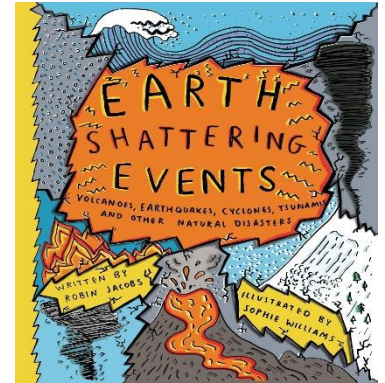
Earth-Shattering Events: Volcanoes, earthquakes, cyclones, tsunamis and other natural disasters by Robin Jacobs.
