This Week

There are now only three weeks left until SATs and the year 6 children have been busy with revision. They have also been thinking about job opportunities in the local area and how they might change in the future during their geography lessons. In R.E. we have been exploring moral dilemmas and thinking about influences which help us when we have tricky decisions to make. In P.E. they have been focusing on tennis and athletics.

Next Week

Next week, we are continuing with our revision work in English and maths. In science we will be finding out about inheritance and variation and in R.E. we will be exploring dilemmas in religious stories.

Homework

Homework will continue with Grammar, punctuation and maths up until the SATS. As we get closer, we would also like to encourage children to spend some time thinking about any areas they feel less confident in and using their books as a revision tool to support them in these areas.

Reading

Please ensure your child's Reading Record is signed by an adult each week. Children should be reading every evening for at least 15 minutes and, where possible, to an adult. The children should record at least 5 entries per week, which should include the **page numbers they have read each time** and the title of the book they are reading. Please ensure that your child is recording the page numbers they have read so that we can see how much they are reading at home. All books can be changed during the class Library Session.

Notices and Reminders

Please can we ask that children re-stock their pencil cases. There are a few who need black pens, green pens and new pencils.

Could children please ensure they have full NAMED kit in school to do PE which includes a t-shirt, jumper, track suit bottoms and top and trainers. Thank you.

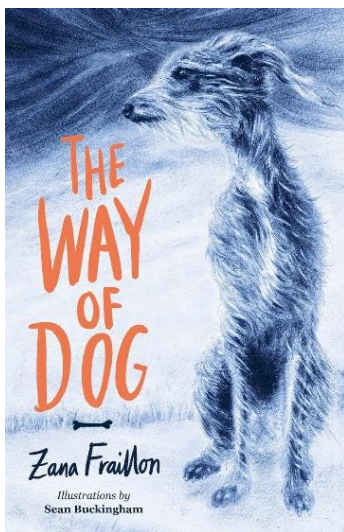
