# WHOLE SCHOOL DESIGN & TECHNOLOGY AFTERNOON: SET DESIGN CHALLENGE

This week, the children took part in an exciting whole-school Design and Technology afternoon focused on set design.

We drew inspiration from the books and short films we have studied in English throughout the year. The children were challenged to design and create imaginative prototypes of film sets using a range of materials and construction techniques.

Year 3 created spectacular ice palaces inspired by The Pugs of the Frozen North.

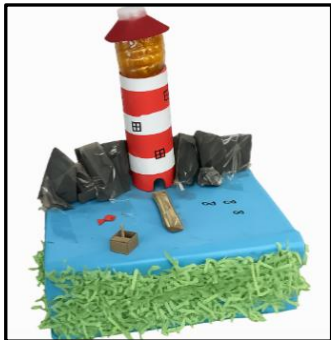


Year 4 designed and built the famous wardrobe leading to Narnia from The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe. There were some amazing pieces made entirely from recycled materials brought in from home.

Year 5 constructed survival shelters based on Kensuke's Kingdom using cardboard and natural resources such as sticks, twigs and leaves.



Year 6 designed impressive lighthouses inspired by a short film they have studied this year.



Children worked both independently and collaboratively in teams, demonstrating excellent creativity, problem-solving skills and perseverance throughout the afternoon. The finished creations were truly outstanding. We were extremely proud of the enthusiasm, teamwork and imagination shown by all. ## Sports News

### DISTRICT ATHLETICS COMPETITION

On Monday morning, our Athletics teams travelled to Hillingdon Leisure Centre to compete in the annual District Competition. The squad had been training hard every Friday morning, perfecting the specific events they had trialled for earlier in the academic year. After a brief warm-up, as temperatures began to rise, it was go-time! The first event was the 600m long-distance race. Arvin and Albie ran brilliantly in a tough field, securing valuable points for Whiteheath. Lara then delivered a fantastic performance, placing third to pick up our school's first medal of the day.

While the field events were underway, the track action intensified. Our sprinters faced relentless competition in the heats, fighting for a spot in the finals. Bea and Chloe both won their respective heats to secure places in the top eight, while Daniel dominated his heat to seal his spot in the boys' final. Meanwhile, in the field, Amber and Ruby jumped superbly in the Standing Long Jump, narrowly missing out on the top spots against tough competition.



One of the morning's standout moments came from Zachary, who claimed a spectacular second-place finish. Zach has trained immensely hard over the last few weeks and was incredibly excited to represent Whiteheath. He certainly did not disappoint, bringing home a silver medal and making Mr Newing, Miss Wells, and the entire school incredibly proud.



The finals brought even more excitement. Chloe was outstanding, sprinting to a second-place finish to secure another silver medal for Whiteheath. Bea also ran excellently to finish fourth; a heroic effort considering she was battling an injury. In the boys' final, Daniel added to the medal tally with a brilliant third-place finish. Huge congratulations to all three for turning their hard work and talent into podium success.



The day concluded with the high-energy 4x100m relays. Our Year 5 boys and girls ran exceptionally well but just missed out on podium places. The Year 6 boys fought hard in a highly competitive group and did themselves proud. Finally, the Year 6 girls capped off a successful morning by securing third place, adding four more bronze medals to Whiteheath's tally.

Overall, it was a highly competitive day, and Whiteheath ultimately finished 6th out of the competing schools.

All of the children worked incredibly hard and should be immensely proud of their efforts—as their coaches always are. We have a fantastic foundation to build on and plenty of motivation for next year!

# Online Safety

Each week we are going to include a guide in this newsletter, covering different aspects of online safety, to help ensure children and young people are supported and protected online. We aim to reach and engage our entire school community, fostering a collaborative approach to promoting online safety and digital citizenship.

## What Educators Need to Know about INVOICE FRAUD

Invoice fraud, including payment diversion fraud, occurs when criminals deceive you into paying a fake invoice or redirect a genuine payment into their own bank account. Fraudsters may impersonate suppliers, intercept emails, or send convincing invoices to prompt urgent payment into fraudulent accounts. It is one of the most common and costly forms of financial crime affecting individuals, businesses, and schools.

### WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

- COMMUNICATIONS CLAIMING URGENCY**  
Communications that claim to be urgent or highlight late payments may be a key sign. Fraudsters often apply pressure to rush decisions and stop checks. Take a moment to verify the request using trusted contacts before making any payment.
- MINOR EMAIL CHANGES**  
Look out for slight changes to a supplier's email address, such as extra characters or spelling differences. Fraudsters often use similar looking addresses to appear genuine. Always check the sender carefully and verify any concerns using known contact details before responding or making a payment.
- CHANGES TO BANK DETAILS**  
Receiving messages saying a regular supplier has changed their bank account details can be a warning sign. Fraudsters may impersonate contacts to redirect payments. Always verify changes first using known supplier contact details.
- UNEXPECTED PAYMENT REQUESTS**  
Invoices or payment requests for goods or services you do not recognise can be a warning sign. Fraudsters may send false invoices hoping they will be paid without question. Check records and confirm with the supplier before processing any unauthorised request.
- DISCREPANCIES AGAINST PREVIOUS INVOICES**  
Be wary of invoice details that don't match authentic, previously issued invoices, such as amounts, reference numbers or contact names. Fraudsters often alter email details to avoid detection. Always query any differences using your supplier's contact details.
- UNUSUAL LANGUAGE OR TONE**  
Messages with unusual wording, grammar or spelling compared to your usual supplier communications may indicate fraud. Criminals often copy legitimate messages but may not match the usual tone or style. The use of artificial intelligence (AI) means errors are no longer as common as before. Be cautious and verify the request if anything seems out of place.

### Advice for Parents & Educators

- VERIFY BANK DETAILS**  
Always confirm any changes to a supplier's bank details before making a payment. Use a trusted phone number or a long-standing contact you have used before, not the details provided in the request. This helps ensure you are dealing with a genuine supplier and prevents payments being redirected to fraudsters.
- CROSS-CHECK INVOICES**  
Compare new invoices with those previously issued by the supplier in question. Check key details such as amounts, bank details, reference numbers and contact information. Differences may indicate fraud, so always investigate and verify anything that does not match before making a payment.
- DUAL PAYMENT APPROVAL**  
Ask a trusted person to review and approve high-value payments. A second set of eyes can help spot unusual details or warning signs that might otherwise be missed. This adds an extra layer of control and reduces the risk of errors or fraudulent payments being processed.
- REPORT FRAUD QUICKLY**  
If you suspect fraud, act immediately. Contact your bank using 105 or their official number and report it to Report Fraud online or by calling 0300 223 2549. Keep all emails and documents. For more guidance, or to register for counter fraud alerts, see [DFE counter fraud guidance](#). You can find the invoice fraud leaflet on the National Crime Agency website.

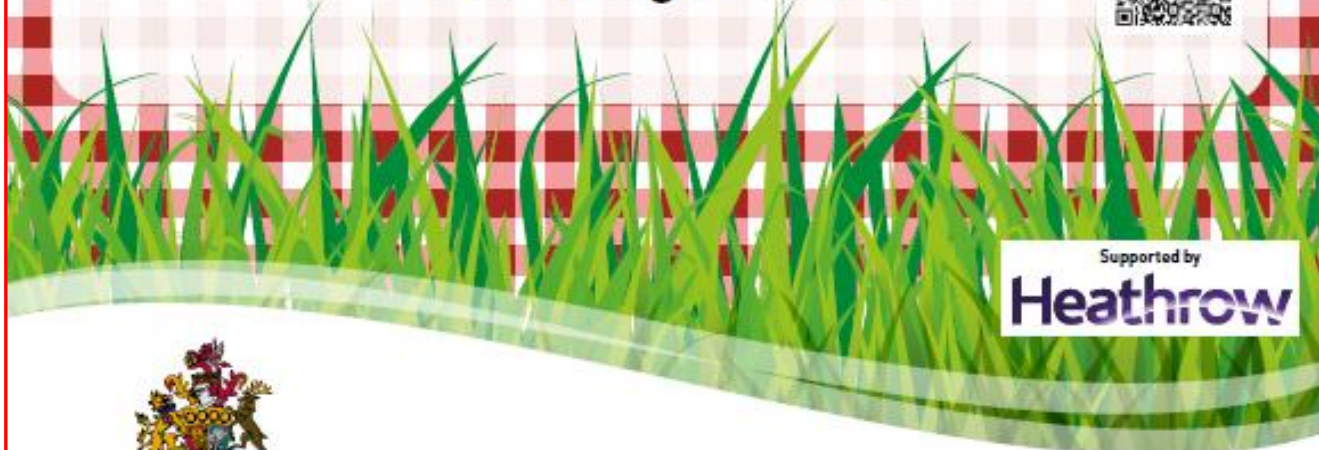

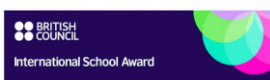
