This Week

This week the children have been learning about the skills of persuasion to help them with their complaint letters – be prepared for them to try these on you over the weekend! Next Week

Next week, we will be creating different types of switches in science and learning about Edith Clarke. In R.E. we will be looking at worship in Hinduism and exploring the painting 'Five' by Lubaina Himid as part of our art lessons.

Homework

Reading

We're delighted to see that most children are reading regularly at home. The amount of time children spend reading for pleasure has a clear impact on their writing, vocabulary, spelling, thinking skills and ability to verbalise their ideas. Children need to be reading for at least 15 minutes every night and, if possible, to an adult. Please ensure your child's Reading Record is signed by an adult. All books can be changed during the class Library Session.

Next week, we will be setting up a class battle on TTrackstars. Please encourage the children to take part. They all have logins and can play on computers, tablets or phones.

Notices and Reminders

Please ensure that your child has a pencil case in school with the necessary equipment, including an erasable black ink pen for handwriting (a 'frixion' pen or similar is ideal), green pen for editing, pencil, sharpener, rubber, a 30cm ruler, whiteboard pen, coloured pencils and a glue stick. It would also be useful to have refills for their ink pens. Year 6 P.E./Games lessons are on Wednesdays and Thursdays and children should have their full PE kits available in school for these days. 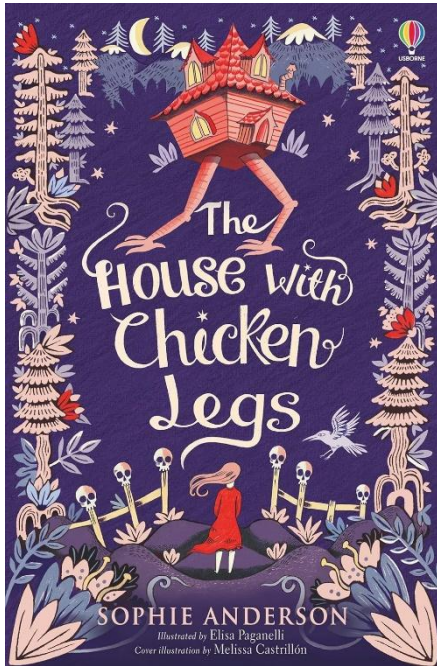
