Dear Parents/Carers,

It has been lovely to see everyone back to school this week and the year 6 children have made an excellent start, settling in really well and showing a really good attitude to learning. They look very smart in their uniforms too so thank you very much.

This Week

There has been lots to sort out this week to get everyone settled in to their new classes. We have been looking at place value in maths, creating our year 6 title page in art lessons and exploring original fairy stories in English. We have also given out application forms for House Captain positions which need to be in by next Wednesday.

Next Week

Next week, we will be carrying out some assessments but will also be looking at how description, action and dialogue are used in fairy stories in our English lessons. In maths, we will be moving into maths sets and we will be developing our map skills in geography lessons. We will also be finding out about electricity in science.

Homework

Year 6 will be given a homework book to take home. All homework will go out on a Tuesday and will be due in on the Monday of the following week. Please remind your child that spellings and reading are also part of the homework. Please also encourage your child to use times tables rockstars regularly to improve their fluency with multiplication.

Reading

Please ensure your child's Reading Record is signed by an adult. Children should be reading every evening for at least 15 minutes and, where possible, to an adult. All books can be changed during the class Library Session.

Notices and Reminders

Please ensure that your child has a pencil case in school with the necessary equipment, including an erasable black ink pen for handwriting (a 'frixion' pen or similar is ideal), green pen for editing, pencil, sharpener, rubber, a 30cm ruler, whiteboard pen, coloured pencils and a glue stick. It would also be useful to have refills for their ink pens. Year 6 P.E./Games lessons are on Wednesdays and Thursdays and children should have their full PE kits available in school for these days. However, there are many sports clubs and events in year 6 and it would be useful for all children to keep their kits in school Monday to Friday. Please ensure ALL items are named. Even year 6's struggle to recognise their own kits sometimes.

Secondary School Transition: Many secondary schools are holding open evenings over the next few weeks where you are able to visit the schools, along with your child, and ask questions to help you make a decision about your child's secondary school application. Please look at the various schools' websites to find out when these are taking place as some are as early as next week.

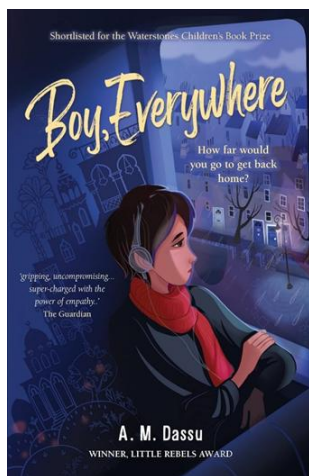
